We met as a hybrid Meeting, in-person & via Zoom.

The Meeting opened with silent worship.

Action Items and Seasoning for December:

- Correct & approve the Draft Minutes & Record from 11-13-2022.
- Consider proposed Minute about Nisenan Land Acknowledgment.

Query: What makes you grateful about being a part of Grass Valley Friends Meeting? There were a range of answers.

The draft Minute & Record of 10-9-22 was corrected then approved.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

STEWARDSHIP: Mary noted that the need to replace the Meeting's computer used by the Treasurer has been resolved. A donated computer and printer can use our existing QuickBooks program and are in use.

Purchase of an "Owl" (see owllabs.com online) to improve communications in our hybrid meetings is supported by both our Spirit & Witness & Stewardship committees. Stewardship committee recommends a Minute authorizing purchase of an Owl for our Meeting. Minute 2022.11.1 was drafted, discussed, & approved.

MINUTE 2022.11.1 – Grass Valley Friends Meeting approves purchase of an "Owl" and necessary related items for up to \$1,200. This money (as needed) is in addition to specific donations individuals may make to facilitate this purchase.

SPIRIT & WITNESS: Dorothy provided the report. *Land Acknowledgment* – Spirit and Witness recommends that Grass Valley Friends Meeting begin the practice of reading the Nisenan Land Acknowledgment at the beginning of Meeting for Worship each week. The Nisenan Land Acknowledgment is:

We acknowledge the Nisenan people are still here among us today, though they are nearly invisible, and their story continues to be excluded from history.

We understand we are on Nisenan land that was never ceded, and the original tribal families have yet to recover from the near genocide of their people.

As a resident or visitor in Nisenan land, we support the Nevada City Rancheria Nisenan tribe in efforts to stabilize their people as well as the campaign to restore tribal sovereignty through federal recognition.

MINUTE Proposed, for Seasoning: Grass Valley Friends Meeting shall practice reading the Nisenan Land Acknowledgement at the beginning of Meeting for Worship each week.

OWL: Spirit and Witness supports the purchase of an Owl to improve the experience of meeting participants both in the Meetinghouse and on zoom.

MEMBERSHIP: With Spirit & Witness' recommendation, the following two Minutes were approved with joy.

MINUTE 2022.11.2 – Grass Valley Friends Meeting approves the transfer of membership for David Cowen and welcomes him to Grass Valley Friends Meeting.

MINUTE 2022.11.3 – Grass Valley Friends Meeting approves the transfer of membership for Cheryl Hendrickson and welcomes her to Grass Valley Friends Meeting.

Crystal Scanlon is canceling her membership request. She hopes to find a way to establish a Worship group where she lives that would be under the care of Inland Valley Meeting so she can worship with others in person.

WELCOME COMMITTEE: Kathy reported that coffee & tea are again available after Meeting, a sign-up clipboard is available.

Our potluck Christmas party will be at Doug & Dorothy's on Sunday, 12-4-22, after rise of Meeting. And new name-tags are being created.

CHILDREN: Dorothy detailed that a play, starring our children will be part of our Christmas party. The playwrights are Karen & Judy. The committee intends seasonal field trips focusing on Nisenan use of the land – ideas are brodea, the Yuba, acorns, & salmon. The four Saturdays involved will be announced in advance.

INTERFAITH NEVADA COUNTY (INC): Dianne described the activities & challenges of INC. INC exists to provide solace and support to Faith Community Leaders in a confidential, spiritual setting.

Advices and Queries, Eleventh Month: Social and Civic Responsibility

In the words of William Penn, "True godliness don't draw men out of the world, but enables them to live better in it and excites their endeavors to mend it." Elsewhere he commented: "It is a reproach to religion and government to suffer so much poverty and excess.

Poverty within a wealthy society is unjust, cruel, and often linked to skin color, gender, and language. We must examine our own privilege and role in the economic order that deepens this disparity. Friends should be alert to oppression and injustice, and persistent in working against them.

We value our part in shaping the laws of our country. Our task is to see that laws serve God's purposes and build a just social order. Our first allegiance should be to God, and if this conflicts with any compulsion of the state, we serve our country best by remaining true to our higher loyalty.

If, by divine leading, our attention is focused on a law that is contrary to God's law, we must proceed with care. Before acting, Friends should pray for further guidance and speak with the Meeting, family members, and all those who might be affected by the decision. If a decision involves disobedience to the law, we should

make the grounds of our action clear to all concerned and be prepared to suffer any penalties without evasion. As a community, we must care for those who suffer for conscience's sake.

- What am I doing to carry my share of responsibility for the government of our community, nation, and world?
- Am I persistent in my efforts to promote constructive change?
- How do we attend to the suffering of others in our local community, in our state and nation, and in the world community?
- Do we try to understand the causes of suffering, and do we address them as a Meeting?
- How do we, individually and as a Meeting, support the organizations that work to bring the testimonies of Friends into reality in our society?



A Prayer for Thanksgiving by <u>Dutton</u> on November 20, 2013 in <u>General</u>

I was led to share with you a prayer that was shared with me while I attended Harvard Divinity School. The prayer is written by the great American peace activist and prisoner of conscience <u>Elizabeth McAlister</u>.

Season of winter, be our teacher. Season of harvested fields and food stored up, teach us to know when enough is enough. Replace our restless striving for more and more with a spirit of deep gratitude and engaged compassion for those with empty eyes and parched hopes.

Season of winter, be our teacher. Season of darkness, death and dying, teach us to hear the death that rattles around us, to hear the cries of a world dying at our own hands – sisters and brother and the earth itself devoured by our greed and violence. May we know that it is only through hearing and heeding that we will become fully human.

And when our spirits wither, give us the hope of this season, when dark nights slowly yield to the light's ineluctable strength. When our spirits falter, give us the love this season, when birth erupts from the heart of death.

And when we taste the ashes of sorrow and forget the bread of life, give us the faith of this season to believe that it all has meaning, that nothing – nothing – is lost.

When we are tempted to look away from our sisters and brothers in need, give us the deep conviction of our communion with all life so we never drift from this table of fellowship and starve in the desert of selfishness. Let us partake of this meal in a spirit of unity. In a world where food is a weapon, let us take from this table the bread of peace.
