#### Clerks' Remarks and Query

"It is a time of bona fide worship that brings all into the presence of God. Business is done in the spirit of worship." Do you recall a time you sensed our conducting business that we were doing this in the context of worship? What practices appeared to support the sense of worship in the meeting?

- A Friend shared that it is a support to not to do handwork during Meeting for Worship for Business to let her hands rest in Spirit as well as her ears and eyes.
- A Friend queries himself, "What do I do to prepare for Meeting for Worship?" Finding the center, stilling thoughts, finding receptivity to spirit that allows hearing of messages. Also, not coming to Meeting for Worship for Business with an agenda.
- Another Friend shared that periods of silence are helpful, to lead back into worship.
- Addressing conflicts in worship rather than having conflicts unacknowledged is very valuable.
- It can be very helpful when Friends come to Meeting for Business having done work outside the meeting in addressing others' potential concerns.
- Everyone is unified in holding the Meeting so that the clerk does not have to "herd cats."
- To stop, be quiet, let it settle, trust the direction that the Meeting is moving in.

## **Grass Valley Friends Meeting Treasurer's Quarterly Report: 2-11-2022**

This report covers four months, October thru January. The contributions you provided in those months (\$6,659) exceeded spending from our General Fund (\$5,956), thank you.

Our Meetings for Worship are now combined, both in-person and participation via Zoom. We have paid rent to Sierra Friends Center (SFC) for January & February. And the internet access at the Meeting House is now functioning reasonably well. So we are paying for internet also, starting with January.

The "Fund Balances" & the "Actual Spending vs Budget" reports are available in the Meeting House and by contacting me. Our annual dues to Pacific Yearly Meeting (\$3,136) were paid in full last month. That is a relief. Our Sharing fund & our Placer County Worship Group fund have each increased. The other Restricted Funds are unchanged.

Thank you for your help. All gifts, both in service to the Meeting & financial are deeply appreciated.

## The Hybrid Body of Christ by Micah Bales

This is a sermon that I preached on Sunday, 1/23/22, at Berkeley Friends Church (via videoconference). The scripture reading for this sermon was: 1 Corinthians 12:12-31a. You can listen to the audio, or keeping scrolling to read my manuscript. (The spoken sermon differs from the written text.)

The last two years have been a long decade.

None of us had any idea, when this pandemic started, how long it would last and how profoundly it would shape our lives. It's shaped us on an individual level and as families. It has also transformed what it means for us to be a Christian community as Berkeley Friends Church.

Two years ago, we were – like most churches – a totally analog experience. We met in person, in a brick-and-mortar building. We shared food and coffee. We sang songs and shook hands at the end of worship.

The last two years have been a long decade. It's been a time that has seen us transform into something more than a local church. We have people who are real, active parts of our community who are living in places like Stockton, California – which isn't quite in range of our meeting house in Berkeley. Others are coming in from much farther away: the East Coast, Ohio, Kansas, Honduras, the suburbs of Paris. We have become more than a local church; we're global now.

We've also become less than a local church. Many of our good friends and members of this church have not been included in this digital transformation. For a variety of reasons, many of us have simply not been attending for the last two years. We're hopeful that many of these friends will rejoin us as we return to in-person worship, but we know that some will not. This pandemic has been a time of growth, but also of diminishment.


