The Meeting opened with silent worship.

CLERK'S REMARKS

- The purpose of our meetings for business is to seek the Spirit's will for us as a community. We are here to worship and not to get through an agenda.
- If you want to suggest that we take some time for worship or take more time between speakers, please say, "Clerk, can we have some time for silence" or use the Time Out sign.
- Being a clerk is a role assigned to one or two people, but clerking is a bunch of behaviors that we all can engage in, and I hope we all will.
- We leave room for Spirit to come through, releasing our thoughts, judgements, opinions and becoming silent inside and out. We can hand our issues to Spirit/God/Jesus, and then settle into any sensations or messages coming through.

REPRESENTATIVE and OFFICER REPORTS

- Newsletter Editor: Dianne Marshall reminded Friends to send items into the newsletter. An issue with the mail for Meeting was raised. The mail has been accumulating in the mailbox in the Meetinghouse, and some of the mail is for representatives whose positions are unfilled. It was noted that any mail in the past that was uncategorized went to the Clerk(s). The Co-clerks will follow through with Dianne to pick up the mail.
- **Pacific Yearly Meeting:** Don McCormick reported. RepCom took place, and more information from that gathering will be forthcoming.
- **Right Sharing of World Resources:** Judy Hamilton reported that a packet of stamps was sent to RSWR.
- Interfaith Nevada County: Dianne Marshall reported on the Interfaith Solidarity March for Peace and Justice on April 11.

COMMITTEE REPORTS (see reports appended, committee clerk is noted in bold)

NOMINATING COMMITTEE: Pat Phillips gave a proposal to the Meeting that all nominations would be for one year. Concerns were raised for the need for staggered terms to insure continuity, especially on Ministry and Nominating. There are a few persons doing the business of Meeting. Several Friends spoke to the issue. The size of Spirit and Witness (formerly Ministry and Oversight) ensures more continuity than Nominating, which is much smaller. The Meeting came to unity on the proposed minute, which will now season for one month before being brought back to Meeting for Business in 4th Month.

Judy read the report, attached.

Discernment on reading the acknowledgment to the Nisenan in Meeting: The Land Acknowledgment drafted by the Nisenan (see attached) was read in Meeting. Spirit and Witness is recommending that this be read in Meeting. It was also recommended that this statement be posted on the website and in the newsletter. Several Friends spoke to the issue.

The frequency of the acknowledgment and where it would be shared was discussed, as well as the length of the newsletter, the numbness of repetition, and the importance of follow through.

The options that were discussed included:

- Reading the full Acknowledgement at the end of meeting or at the beginning of meeting, every Meeting or once per month
- A shorter statement spoken by the Greeter every week with the longer statement once per month.
- Asking people in Meeting who are on other lands to acknowledge the original people of the land they are joining Meeting from.

It was asked that this be shared as a prayer to help us find our way to harmony with this land and the people who have inhabited it for thousands of years. The work that we are asking of ourselves is to go way beyond acknowledging and formulate a real plan to redress the damage that has been done. It was noted that regaining their tribal status is the primary pressing need that the Nisenan have at the current time. The Ancestral Homelands Reciprocity Program is another way to donate to the tribe. The Ancestral Homelands Reciprocity Program is a community generated initiative to support and uplift the Nevada City Rancheria Nisenan Tribe through their tribally guided 501(c)(3) nonprofit CHIRP (California Heritage: Indigenous Research Project).

It was proposed that this issue be returned to Spirit and Witness for more discernment. It was suggested that we acknowledge the Nisenan in the meantime by posting their Land Acknowledgment statement on our website.

Minute 03.2021.01: Grass Valley Friends Meeting came to unity on posting the Nisenan Land Acknowledgment on their website.

STEWARDSHIP: Mary Starr, Gordon Starr, Reed Hamilton, Pat Phillips, Doug Hamm, Fosten Wilson (Treasurer, Ex-officio), Dianne Marshall (Librarian), Hayley Wilson

Gordon Starr read the report, attached.

The Committee brought forward an idea that GVFM contribute \$100 donation per month in lieu of rent to Sierra Friends Center. We currently donate \$400 per year to Sierra Friends Center and are not paying rent because we are not occupying the Meetinghouse. Friends asked if we should be saving that money instead? It was suggested that we donate our annual contribution split into four payments. The Meeting did not reach unity on additional donations.

- Logo: Don shared the proposed logo with Meeting. The logo will be shared on the Email Tree and in the newsletter for seasoning until 4th Month.

- Roles in the Welcome Committee: It is proposed that the Website Coordinator, the Email Coordinator, and the Zoom Coordinator be added as ex officio members to this Committee. This matter will now go to the Nominating Committee and Spirit and Witness Committee.



The heart of the Religious Society of Friends is the Meeting for Worship. In direct communion with God, we offer ourselves for God's will. Our daily lives are linked with the Meeting for Worship, the Meeting for Worship with our daily lives.

Come regularly to Meeting for Worship, even when you are angry, tired, or spiritually cold. Bring your joys and your hurts, and the needs of other people. Accept and support each other in the community where God dwells among us. As you do so, you may find the grace of prayer.

At times, the Spirit may prompt you to speak in Meeting. Wait patiently to know that the sense and the time are right. When you are sure, have confidence that the words will be given to you. Listen to the ministry of others with an open spirit. If it is not God's word for you, it may be for others. After a message has been given, allow time to ponder its meaning and to let the Meeting return to silent worship. In speech and in silence, each person contributes to the Meeting.



MOST READ ARTICLE IN FRIENDS JOURNAL, 2020

"The Middle-Class Capture of Quakerism and Quaker Process": Friends Journal's Most Read Article of 2020

I was surprised to find out that "The Middle Class Capture of Quakerism and Quaker Process" was the most read article of 2020 for the magazine "Friends Journal." I was surprised because the online version of the article had only five comments. I thought that hardly anyone read it. The article is an edited transcript of a conversation I had with George Lakey as I drove him from Grass Valley to San Francisco. He came to Grass Valley to do a workshop on how to mount effective nonviolent direct action campaigns, which is the subject of his book *How We Win*. (He also led some of us in singing show tunes after the workshop.) George wrote the book *Viking Economics* and trains organizers.
