# **Nisenan Land Acknowledgment**

We acknowledge the Nisenan people are still here among us today, though they are nearly invisible, and their story continues to be excluded from history.

We understand we are on Nisenan land that was never ceded, and the original tribal families have yet to recover from the near genocide of their people.

As a resident or visitor in Nisenan land, we support the Nevada City Rancheria Nisenan tribe in efforts to stabilize their people as well as the campaign to restore tribal sovereignty through federal recognition.

## Gather

Spiritual Life Program, Fifth Month, Sunday, May 28, 2023, 11:30 am

Dean and Karen Olson will be showing the documentary, "Gather" on food sovereignty.

*Gather* is an intimate portrait of the growing movement amongst Native Americans to reclaim their spiritual, political and cultural identities through food sovereignty, while battling the trauma of centuries of genocide.

*Gather* follows Nephi Craig, a chef from the White Mountain Apache Nation (Arizona), opening an indigenous café as a nutritional recovery clinic; Elsie Dubray, a young scientist from the Cheyenne River Sioux Nation (South Dakota), conducting landmark studies on bison; and the Ancestral Guard, a group of environmental activists from the Yurok Nation (Northern California), trying to save the Klamath river.

Using queries to gain a group sense of where we have come from and where we are now, we will then use worship sharing queries to explore how and where our faith and practice, our spirit and witness, is leading us.

We will be assisted in this effort by the process and queries offered by the Indigenous Peoples 'Concerns Subcommittee of the Ministry Committee of Pacific Yearly Meeting at 2023 Representative Committee. We hope you can join us!
